Ortho's EL Programs

LANGUAGE & LITERACY (L & L) A & 2A

- Aprendices en ingles

ADV ELD A & 2A

- Los estudiantes aprenden los estandares academicos de California en ingles

Reclassification criteria

- 1. Pass English class with a 'C' or better/Teacher Evaluation
- 2. Meets Basic Skills criteria, as tested
 - Basic, Proficient or Advanced on Reading Inventory, or 'Standard Met' or 'Standard Exceeded' on the ELA SBA (Grade 11).
- 3. Pass the ELPAC (English Language Proficiency Assessment)
 - Reading Students need an overall
 - Writing performance level of 4.
 - Speaking
 - Listening
- Parent Consultation.

Student Support and Progress Team

If a student has tested well enough, and only a low or failing grade in their grade-level English (ELA) class is keeping them from reclassification, then a meeting can be held with the Student Support and Progress Team (SSPT) to evaluate possible reclassification.

If your child fits this criteria, you will receive a letter inviting you to attend the SSPT meeting. More information can be found here:

Students should read English at least 20 minutes every day, weekends included.



Assigned Novels

Assigned by grade level and course (L&L or ADV ELD).

Grade 10: It's Kind of a Funny Story/The Book Thief

Grade 11: The Fault in our Stars/Unwind

Grade 12: The Chocolate War/Before I Fall

Assigned Textbooks

- Students will also have reading and writing work based on these textbooks.

English 3D I or English 3D II
Reader's Handbook
Write Source

Adaptive Reading Program

Read Theory provides short reading selections and quizzes designed to gradually improve students' reading ability.

This program adapts to the students increasing skill by providing slightly more challenging texts.

Information is tracked on every quiz taken, by date, and provides real data on student cognition.



READING INVENTORY

- Standardized Reading Test
- Given in the Fall and/or Spring
- Can be given to certain students as a Bridge to Reclassification (BTR)
- Higher grade levels must achieve a higher score to achieve Basic, Proficient, or Advanced.

Students with I.E.P.'s or 504 Plans

- Students with Disabilities who participate in EL programs have the same opportunities to redesignate as everyone else.
- Accommodations during the ELPAC and Reading Inventory can be provided, based on the students' individual needs, as determined in their Individual Education Plans (I.E.P.'s)
 - Extended time
 - Listening or Visual enhancement
 - Possible elimination of one of the tested criteria if no accommodations exist for it.
- Students with Disabilities may be redesignated through an I.E.P.
